The soil embraced in these two claims, especially that portion that is included in the net area of same, consists of a flow of dacite, which having irregularly eroded away has left the surface covered with boulders of various sizes.

There is practically no vegetation on the claims, excepting a scant growth of grass and weeds, and, on the portion that conflicts with the Maurel Homestead, a small orchard of fruit trees.

The only stream that crosses through the claims is Pinal Creek, which crosses the N. W. end of the Fine Gold Placer.

The workings^{of} these claims consist of a Quarry on the Maurel Placer, the S. E. Cor. of which bears N. 71°-14' W. 308.0 ft. from Cor. 1 of said Maurel Placer and extends thence S. 66°-45' W. 420.0. This is an irregular shaped excavation where stone for building and other purposes has been removed, From measurements taken, it is estimated as averaging 2 ft. deep, 80 ft. wide and 420 ft. long.

I also find that quarrying has been done from the bedding in the quarry designated as No. 1 in the field notes of this survey. It is conservatively estimated that an expenditure of \$3000.00 has been made in the removal of stone from this quarry.

Quantities of stone have been removed from these claims and hauled to the City of Globe and elsewhere to be used for foundations and the construction of buildings.
