The soil embraced in these two claims, especially that portion that is included in the net area of same, consists of a flow of dacite, which having irregularily eroded away has left the surface covered with boulders of various sizes.

There is practically no vegetation on the claims, excepting a scant growth of grass and weeds, and, on the portion that conflicts with the Maurel Homestead, a small orchard of fruit trees.

The only stream that crosses through the claims is Pinal Creek, which crosses the N. W. end of the Fine Gold Placer.

Quantities of stone have been removed from these claims and hauled to the City of Globe and elsewhere to be used for foundations and the construction of buildings.
