NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.

QUARTZ CLAIM.

To all whom it may concern: This mining claim the name of which is the Pit Gold Mining Claim situate on lands belonging to the United States of America and in which there are valuable mineral deposits was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by J. C. McKee the undersigned on the second day of January 1901.

The length of the claim is Fifteen hundred feet and I claim three hundred feet on each side of the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted) lengthwise of the claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Easterly to the Westerly.

The claim is situated and located in Vulture Mining District in Maricopa County in the Territory of Arizona about twelve hundred feet in a southerly direction from the Vulture Mill.



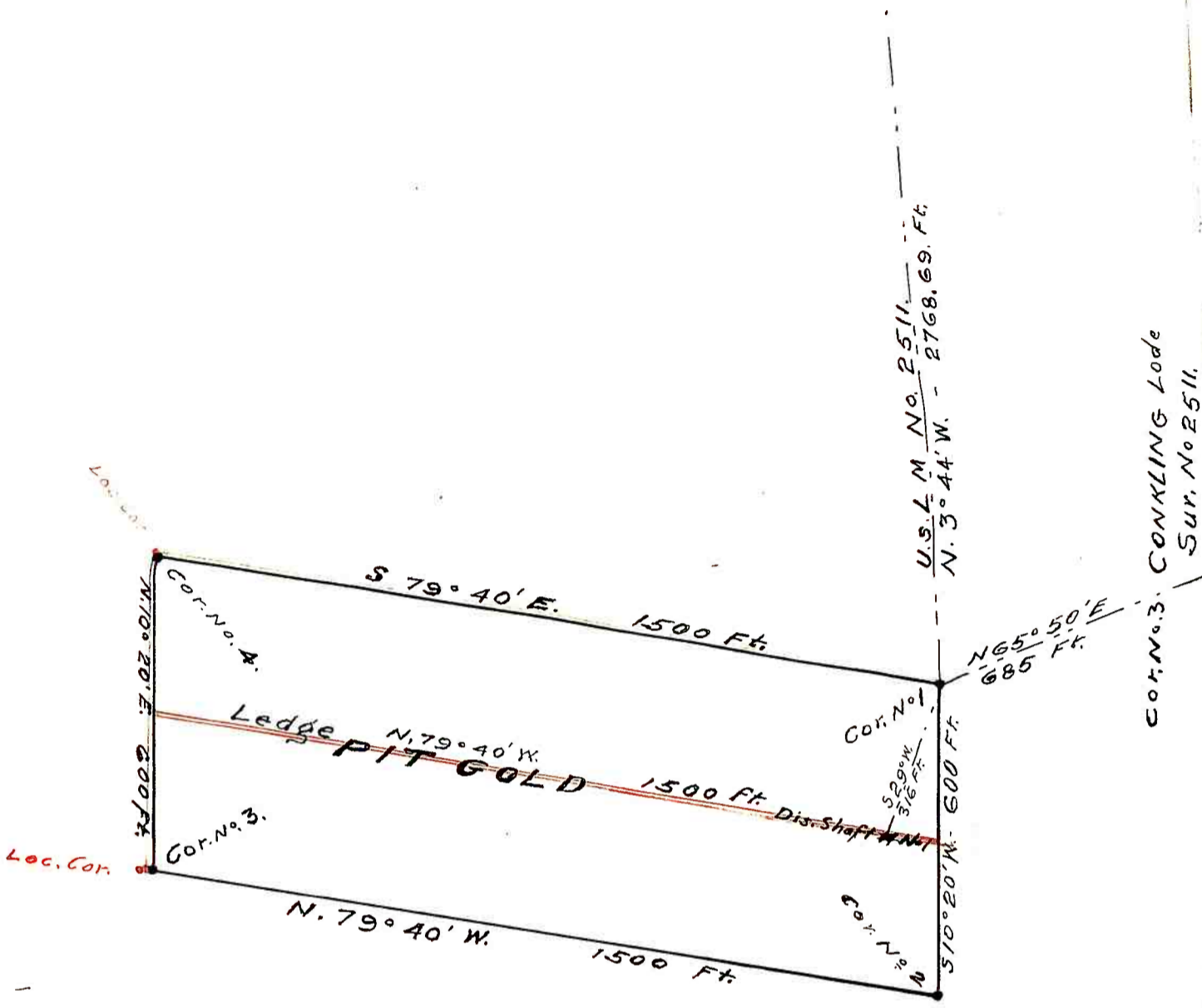
