This claim conflicts with the Peabody Lode, Lot No. 37-A and the Alta Lode, Lot No. 39-A on the West, and with the Grey Eagle Lode, Sur. 2526, W. H. Smith, et al., *and is joined by the Atlanta Lode Sur. No. 2534. W. H. Smith, et al. Claimant, on the East.* The rest of the ground surrounding this claim, so far as known, is Public Domain and subject to entry.

L o c a t i o n .

This claim is located on unsurveyed land, approximately Township 13 North, Range 13 W. of the Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Owens Mining District, Mohave County, Arizona.

I n s t r u m e n t .

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons transit, No. 1 C., and the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation, checked on Polaris. The distances were measured with a 600 and a 100 ft. steel tape.

The disagreements between these field notes and the field notes of the Alta lode, Lot No. 39 A, and the Peabody lode, Lot No. 37 A, are due to errors in the field notes of the Alta and Peabody lodes.

Note:

I do not agree with the courses and mineral monument ties of the Peabody Lode, Lot No. 37-A and the Alta Lode, Lot No. 39-A, and the courses shown by these notes and accompanying preliminary plat were determined by me in the field by the actual corners on the ground, which still stand in good condition and properly marked according to the notes on file in your office.

This Mining claim the name of which is the " DAMFINO" Mining Claim situate on lands belonging to the United State of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by J. L. Witney and subsequently acquired from said Witney by purchase by the undersigned.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred (1500) feet, and I claim three hundred and seventy (370) feet in a Southerly direction and eleven hundred and thirty (1130) feet in a Northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted lengthwise of the claim, together with three hundred (300) feet in width of the surface ground on each side of the center of the claim.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is Northerly and Southerly.

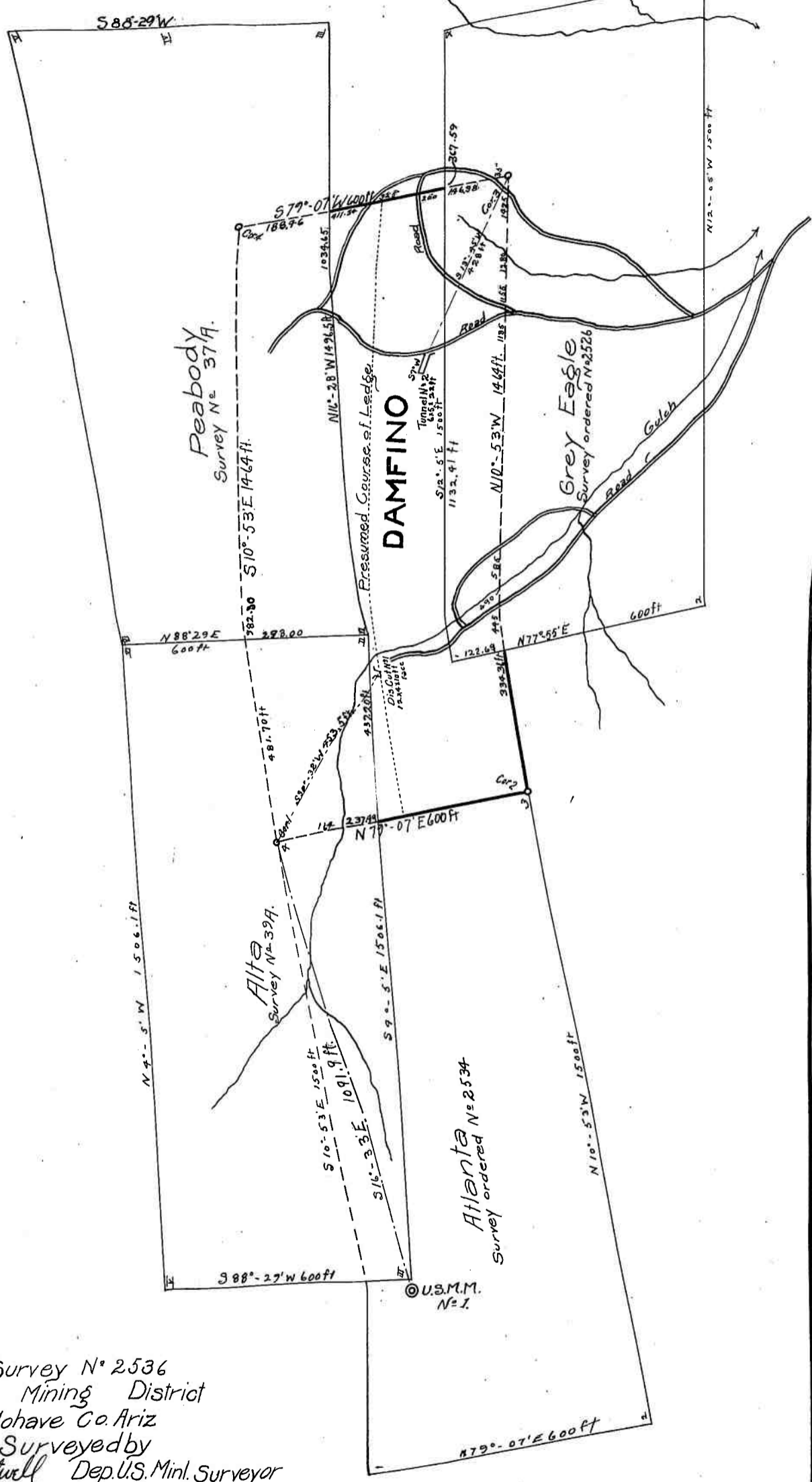
