The southern portion of this claim lies in the Bloody Tanks and Live Oak Sand Washes, the northern portion lies on the side of a steep hill.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 300-ft. steel tape.

The disagreements between these field notes and the location notice are due to errors in the latter.
