NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.

Lode Claim.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Clara May Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and on which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Kentuck-Arizona Copper Co. a corporation, the undersigned, on the 24th day of July, 1906.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and we claim 422 feet in a north-easterly direction, and 1078 feet in a south-westerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. This memorandum cancels the survey of the Clara May lode claim of Mineral Survey No. 2544.

The plat and field notes should remain in the files. This memorandum should be made a part of the original field notes of Mineral Survey No. 2544.

The Clara May lode was located by the Kentucky-Arizona Copper Company on July 24, 1906, and surveyed under Mineral Survey No. 2544, approved February 11, 1909.

The cancellation of the survey of the Clara May lode claim is based on an opinion of the Field Solicitor's office that the claimant, Kentucky-Arizona Copper Company, has dissolved as a legal entity and can no longer hold mining claims.

Articles of Incorporation of the Kentucky-Arizona Copper Company, incorporated in Kentucky in 1905, were filed in Arizona on March 7, 1905, and recorded in the official records of Maricopa County, Arizona. Article IV of these Articles of Incorporation states in pertinent part "The time of commencement of this Corporation shall be the date of the filing of these Articles of Incorporation in the office of the Auditor of the Territory of Arizona, and the termination of said Corporation shall be 25 years thereafter, unless it be renewed in the manner now provided by law."



Since no renewal was requested from the Arizona Corporation Commission, the Company dissolved by operation of law on March 7, 1930. A check of assessment records reveals no assessment work was filed on this claim between 1930 and 1940. Further, the claim was relocated by other parties whose rights have subsequently been adjudicated and, therefore, there does not appear to be any assets in this claim which

could pass to stockholders.

Mineral Survey No. 2544 does not appear on any subsisting plats.
The land embraced by this lode claim has been classified for transfer
to Maricopa County for Park Purposes under application AR-017961.
