

Every notice of location of a mining claim shall contain: First, the name of the claim located; second, the name of the locator; third, the date of location; tourth, the number of feet in length of said claim and the number of feet claimed on each side of the center of the discovery shaft, lengthwise of the claim: fifth, the general course of the lode deposit of premises located; sixth, the locality of the claim with reference to some natural object, or permanent monument, as will identify the claim.


