## INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by direct solar observations, the details of which are returned herein. The distances were measured with two 300 ft. steel tapes.

## R E P O R T.

The section corner common to sections 19 and 30, on the west boundary of T. 1 N., R. 15 E., G. and S.R.B. and M. is a conglomerate stone 6 x 10 ins., extending 8 ins. above the ground, and is marked with 4 nicks on the north edge, and 2 nicks on the south edge, a mound of stone alongside.
