I N S T R U M E N T.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The calculations of the true meridian were returned by me in connection with the field notes of Sur. No. 2638, Gladiator lode.

The distances were measured with two 300-ft. steel tapes.

R E P O R T.

The section corner common to secs. 19 and 30, on the west boundary of T. 1 N., R. 15 E., Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, is a conglomerate stone 6 x 10 ins., extending 8 ins. above the ground, and is marked with four nicks on north edge, and two nicks on south edge; mound of stone alongside.

The location of the end centers of these claims were all 4 x 4 pine posts, set in a mound of stone and properly marked.

SURVEY NO. 2652.

U.S.L.M.No.2652 is a sawed pine post 6" x 8" x 8 ft.long, in large mound of stones, chiseled U S L M 2652. A full description of the setting of same accompanies these returns.
