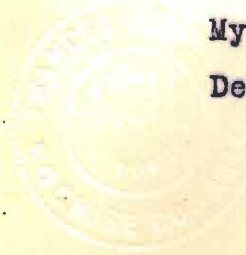

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the COPPER CHIEF Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by S. H. Bryant, a citizen of the United States of America

The length of this claim is Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet, and I claim Five hundred and Seventy three (573) feet, in a Southeasterly direction and Nine hundred and Twenty Seven (927) feet in a Northwesterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with Three hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Northwest to the Southeast
