This survey was made with a C.L.Berger & Sons Transit NO.1 C. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations, checked on Polaris.

The distances were measured with a 100 and a 600 ft. steel tape.

From the Cor of Secs. 7, 12, 13 & 18, Township 13 N.,R.2 and 3 W. which is a stone 18x10x8 in. set in a mound of stone, Whence

A pine 42 in. in diameter Brs. S.74°30'E. 40 ft. marked T.13 N., R.2 W.xVII.,The other bearing tree given in the notes has been destroyed. I ran S.89°45'E. 2613.6 ft. the theoretical point for 1/4 cor. Secs. 7 & 8, failed to find same, 5253.6 ft. the cor. Secs. 7, 8, 17 & 18, a stone 18x12x5 in. set in a mound of stone. No marks could be found

Johns, P.A. Johns and J.L. Munds, Citizens of the United States. the undersigned, on the 31st day of July, 1905.

The length of this claim is Fifteen hundred (1500) feet, and we claim Eleven hundred and fifty (1150) feet, in a Northerly direction and Three Hundred and fifty (350) feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with Three hundred (300) feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South

The claim is situated and located in the Quartz Mt. Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 4 miles in a Southerly direction from Prescott, and about 3 miles in a southeasterly direction from Thumb Butte
