This survey was made with a Buff & Berger Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

 REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line. All the tie lines were run either directly upon the ground or by traverses, run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

The disagreement between the tie lines of this survey and the tie line of the Christmas lode, Sur. No. 2436, is due to errors in the latter.
