This Mining Claim, the name of which is the PASS ME BY Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by A.C. Belcher and I. Chrisman Nov. - 9 - 1906 and amended by the Chrisman and Globe Mining Co. An Arizona Corporation, the undersigned, on the 19th day of October, 1909.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and we claim 25 feet, in a southwesterly direction and 1475 feet in a Northeasterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Southwest to the Northeast.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District, in Gila County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 1 mile in a northerly direction from the Great Eastern Shaft and joins the Home-Sweet-Home, Holy Moses, Two harbors, Wyoming and Sullivan claims.
