NOTE: This claim has been so located that each ten acre subdivision includes marble croppings, while the ground adjacent on the north of the eastern one half of the claim apparently contains no marble. Hence the peculiar form of this claim.

BOWIE MARBLE PLACER.

A) The soil embraced in this claim consists principally of weathered limestone and the sand and gravel of the gulch bottoms.

A few scattered scrub oak and piñon trees are found on the north slopes of the hills with a fair growth of native grasses and in some spots considerable brush.

B) No living streams cross the claim.

C) The surface workings on this claim consist of two marble quarries and an abandoned shaft more particularly described under the head of "Expenditure of Five Hundred Dollars", and "Other Improvements".

D) The nearest Post Office to the claim is Dos Cabezas, situate northwesterly about <sup>(12)</sup> ~~12~~ miles.

Bowie Station on the Southern Pacific R.R. is northerly about 16 miles. Willcox on the same railroad is northwesterly about 26 miles. A continuous down grade with no obstacles to either railroad or wagon road building.

Pearce, on the Arizona and Colorado R.R. is distant about 26 miles in a southwesterly direction.

The Bowie Marble Co., is now operating a marble claim about one mile northwesterly from this claim, transporting their output by means of a large traction engine and platform wagons to a railroad switch a

few miles east of Bowie Station.

E) The Collard Mine survey No. 2741A lies northeasterly about 2 miles.

Des Cabezas, mentioned above, is the center of an active gold and copper mining region.
