INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a W.& L.E.Gurley Mountain transit fitted with a Burt solar by which the true meridian was obtained and checked upon previously determined courses. Measurements were made with a 500 foot steel tape.

REPORT.

All lines of this survey were run directly upon the ground, and it is tied to the closest corner of the public land survey I was able to locate, the corner to Secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, T. 1 N., Rs. 14 and 15 E., being missing.

* Topographical features are such that depth may be obtained on both claims through this tunnel, the highest point being near the common side line. The direction of the tunnel is tending toward that point that will give the greatest depth. Several true fissure veins traverse these claims with numerous cross stringers. Gold is the principal mineral found in pockets and along the stringers, and the tunnel and winze are practical both from a development and extraction stand point for both claims. Considerable commercial ore has already been taken from the Cedar Tree, some \$2000 having been spent in this work during the past year.


