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Report.

The side and end lines of the several claims in this survey and all tie lines were run direct upon the ground.

The standard corner of sections 31 and 32 T.1 N., R. 14 E., Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, to which tie is given, is a granite boulder, 8 x 8 x 8 ins. out of the ground, chiseled with five notches on the east side and one notch on the west side and S C on the north side.

U.S.M.M. No. 3, to which tie is given, is a pine post, 8 ft. long, 6 ins. sq., set 3 ft. in the ground, with mound of earth and stone, scribed U.S.M.M. No. 3, T-1-3756 and C-IV.

The corners of the Continental lode, Lot 37 A., with the exception of Cor. IV, are pine posts properly set and scribed. I find the courses and distances of the lines of this claim correct as approved. At Cor. IV, I found a mound of stone with cedar post, 3 ins. diameter in it.

The corners of the Arizona Wonder No. 1 lode, which conflicts with the Director, Selby and United States Fraction lodes of this survey are pine posts, 4 ins. sq. in mounds of stone.

The disagreement between these notes and the distances from the points of discovery of both the Boston and Argus lodes to the end centers of said claims, as stated in the certificates of location, is due to errors in the latter.

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Resetting of Mineral Monument No. 3.

At Cor. IV of the Continental lode where U.S.M.M. No. 3 was established at the time of making the survey of said Continental lode, I was not able to find the marked

stone which was reported as being set in this monument, and that instead of being as described in the official returns of the survey of said Continental lode was a mound of stone, 4 ft. base and 3 ft. high, with a cedar post, 3 ins. diameter in it.

I have reestablished this monument by setting in the place of the cedar post a pine post, 8 ft. long, 6 ins. sq., with nail driven at the exact point, 3 ft. in the ground and raising a mound of earth and stone, 6 ft. base and 3 ft. high about it, and scribing on said post U.S.M.M. No.3 on the west side, T-1-2756 for the Tunnel lode of Sur. 2756 on the north side and C-IV for the Continental lode, Lot 37 A. on the east side.

A cedar tree. 1.2 ft. in diameter, blazed and scribed on the north side cross (+) B.T.-2756, bears S.05°-19'E. 69.2 ft. Owing to the size and irregularity of the surface of this tree it is impracticable to scribe the initials of the Mineral Monument on it.

Corner 3 of the Badger lode, Sur., 2756, bears N.45°-00'W. 247.4 ft. and the N.E.E.C of said Badger lode bears S.45°-00'E. 49.4 ft.

I find that the bearing to the left hand of the Four Peaks is N.50°-33'W. instead of N.50°-00'W. as reported at the time of establishing this monument. I also find that the bearing to the highest Peak of the Sierra Ancha Mountain is N.32°-53'W. instead of N.32°-45'W. as reported at the time of establishing the monument.

The standard corner of sections 5 and 6, T.1 S., R. 14 E., Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, bears S.02°-37'-10"W. 14526.3 ft.

There are no other bearings available.
