REPORT

The lode line of the location of this claim was run directly on the ground and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line. All tie lines were run directly on the ground, and all corners and end centers were identical with the location corners and end centers. All location corners were stones firmly set in the ground. This claim is identical with the Durango location described and surveyed by Amherst W. Barber Detailed Clerk, G. L. O. under instructions from the Commissioner, dated April 1 st. 1901.

INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with an A. Lietz, light mountain transit, No. 5631, with a solar attachment. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 and 300 ft. steel tapes.

LODE CLAIM.

To All Whom It May Concern:

This mining claim, the name of which is the Anaconda Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America,, and in which there valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by W H Thompson a Citizen of the United States the undersigned, on the 19th day of January, 1901.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 750 feet in a North-erly direction and 750 feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South

The claim is situated and located in the White Mesa Mining District, in Coconino County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 40 miles in a North-erly direction from Tuba City & about 4 miles East of an old Spanish Fort.
