INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100-ft and 300-ft steel tapes.

The section corner referred to above is a quartzite boulder one foot square and extending eight inches out of the ground. On the south side it has chiseled upon it the figure I, and on the north side it has chiseled upon it the following; IIIII.

Adjoining Claims.

As near as I can find out there is no location contiguous to this claim. G.W. REPORT ON " QUARRY PLACER"

(a) The "Quarry Placer" consists of rolling ground, with no Timber. The vegetation is very scarce, and consists of different specie of Cacti, Sage brush, Mesquite, and Catclaw.

The surface of the Claim is covered in most places with a soil that may be classed as Adobe, in which are small boulders of Quartz and Trachite. An overburden of Sand and Gravel covers the soil. In several places small drains have been cut through the surface by rain water. On the North end of the Claim the surface consists of a solid bed of Trachite, this extends South on the Claim for about 300 feet. On the South end of the Claim this Trachite also shows. A well on the Claim and shown on the Map, with the exception of 4 or 5 feet of overburden, consisting of the Adobe and gravel mentioned above, was sunk its entire depth in Trachite.

(b) There are no streams on the Claim.

(c) The surface workings consist of a Quarry, from which building stone has been taken. This Quarry is very irregular but will average 50 feet square and 8 feet deep; a Well 4x4 feet and 64 feet deep as shown on plat.

(d) The Claim is situated about 600 feet East from the Eastern limits of the City of Globe.

(e) The only system of well known lode deposits in the close vicinity is that of the Northern end of the Globe Mining Belt which starts about a Mile and a quarter to the North of the Quarry and where the following Mines are located; Old Dominion, Globe Consolidated, Arizona Commercial, Superior and Boston and The National Mining Expleration Company. There are some claims about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the North of the Quarry Placer in which some

ore has been found. On these claims the ore has been found in pockets, due to the badly faulted and shattered condition of the Country. Where veins are able to be traced they run from East to West.

(f) The "Quarry Placer" claim is not adapted to placer mining, as there is no indication of Gold being present, and there are no Gold deposits in the near vicinity. Water as yet has not been developed on the Claim and it would be very difficult to procure water in any quantity.

The only use this Claim is suitable for in a Mining way is as a Quarry, as the stone from this Quarry is being used extensively for building material and is of a very good grade.

(g) See under Expenditure of Five Hundred Dollars.

(h) There are no Mines, Saltlicks, Salt Springs or Mill sites on the Claim.

The Claim is not adaptable to Agricultural uses owing to the overburden of Gravel and the large amount of Quartz and Trachite on the surface.
