I tied to the U.S.L.M. No. 1528 for the reason that these claims are located more than 2 miles from a corner of the Public Survey.

I established witness corners for Cor. No. 3 of the May lode, identical with Cor. No. 2 of the Malcolm lode, both of this survey, for the reason that the true point for corner fell in a wash, where it would be destroyed during time of floods.
