6 x 9 x 207.5 ft., the N.W. corner of which is on the lode line 594.0 ft. from the W.E.C. Value \$5000.00.

Note.

This shaft is being sunk for the purpose of developing and mining each of the two claims in this survey. At the present time it is down to a depth of 207.5 ft., which is considerably below the surface of each of the claims. The scheme of development proposed to be carried out by the claimant is to continue sinking the shaft, then by drifting and crosscutting to develop and mine each of these claims. The plan of mining and developing two or more claims from one advantageously located working shaft or other system of common improvement being the one generally adopted by the legitimate mining companies operating in this Territory, and in this case a feasible one, consistent with good mining, the value of this shaft is distributed equally to the two claims embraced in the survey, one-half, or \$2500.00 going to each.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a 6¼ inch Berger Engineer's transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Polaris observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

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Report.

The side and end lines of these claims and all tie lines were run direct upon the ground.

The west quarter corner of section 19, to which tie is given, is a quartzite stone, showing 4 x 5 x 9 ins. out of the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the west face.

The east quarter corner of said section 19, to which tie is given is a schist stone, showing 8 x 10 x 12 ins. out of the ground, marked 20 on east face and $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 on west face.

Survey No. 2627, Geneva lode:

The corners of this claim are redwood posts, 4 ins. sq., properly set and scribed. The disagreement between these notes and line 3-4 is nominal.

Brownie lode, unsurveyed:

The corners of this claim are 4 x 4 posts in mounds of stone.

Wednesday lode, Sur.No.2498:

The corners of this claim are 4 x 4 posts, properly set and scribed.

I find the courses of lines 1-2-3 correct as approved.

The disagreement between the tie to the east $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 19, T.1 N., R.15.E., G.& S.R.B.& M., as computed through the lines of this survey, and the same tie as reported in the returns of Sur.No.2498 is due to error in Sur.No.2498.

The disagreement between the area in conflict between the Tribune lode of this survey with the Wednesday lode, Sur.No.2498, and the same conflict as reported in Sur.No.2498, is due partially to errors in said Sur.No. 2498 and to the amending of the Tribune lode subsequent to the execution of said Sur.No.2498.

S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 19, (Ellison Homestead):

The lines of this homestead were determined by subdividing Section 19.

The disagreement between these notes and the notices
of location is due to errors in the latter.
