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Instrument.

This survey was made with a 6 $\frac{1}{4}$  inch Berger engineer's transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Polaris observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

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Report.

The side and end lines of the several claims in this survey and all tie lines were run direct upon the ground.

The quarter corner between sections 20 and 21, T. 1 N., R. 14 E., G. & S.R.B. & M., to which tie is given, is a schist boulder, .4 x .7 x .8 ft. out of the ground, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the W. side:

U.S.L.M. No. 2219, to which tie is given, is a pine post 6 ins. sq., showing 5.5 ft. above the ground, scribed U.S.L.M. - 2219, surrounded by a mound of stone, 5 ft. diameter and 2 ft. high.

SurNo. 2219, Lily and Little Mans lodes:

The corners of these claims are 4 x 4 posts, properly set and scribed. The disagreement between these notes and lines 3-4-1, Lily lode and line 4-1, Little Mans lode is due to errors in SurNo. 2219. I find the bearing of line 3-4, Little Mans lode correct as approved.

The disagreement between these notes and the certificates of location of the claims embraced in this survey is due to errors in said certificates of location.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that The Gibson Copper Co., a corporation, the undersigned, has this 6th day of June, 1909, amended, located and claimed, and by these presents does amend, locate and claim, by right of discovery, ownership and amended location, in compliance with the laws of the United States, and of the laws and local customs of the Territory of Arizona, 1176.4 linear feet, horizontal measurement, on the Hillside lode, vein ledge or deposit, along the vein thereof, with all its dips, angles and variations as allowed by law, together with 224.3 feet on the N.W. side of the middle of said vein at the surface, for full length of claim; 55.4 feet on the S.E. side of the middle of said vein, at the surface, at the N.E. end of said claim and 199.8 feet on the S.E. side of the middle of said vein, at the surface, at the S.W. end of said claim, so far as can be determined from present developments, and all veins, lodes, ledges, or deposits, and surface ground within the lines of said claim.
