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Location.

These claims are located on unsurveyed land, approximately in what will be section 26, T.1 N., R. 14 E., Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Globe Mining District, Gila County, Arizona.

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Adjoining and Conflicting Claims.

The Fulton lode, Sur. ^{No.} 2686, owned by the Live Oak Copper Mining & Smelting Co., on the north. The Copper Glance lode, unsurveyed, owned by A.A. McKinzie, and the Dottontail lode, unsurveyed, owned by William Mill Williams, et al., on the south. And the Copper Queen lode, Sur. ^{No.} 2686, owned by the Live Oak Copper Mining & Smelting Co., on the west.

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Discovery and Improvements.

At the present time there is not sufficient work done upon either of the claims in this survey to bring the value of same up to \$500.00. Prior to the expiration of the period of publication I will submit a supplemental report of additional work to be performed.

I certify that at the present time the labor and

improvements made upon each of the two claims in this survey, by the claimant or its grantors, is as follows:

Goodyear

No.1, the discovery, shaft 4 x 6 x 15 ft., the center of the south side of which is on the lode line 25.0 ft. from the W.E.C. Value \$120.00.

No.2, cut, 6 x 9 x 16 ft., the center of the face of which bears S. 86°-26' E. 131.00 ft. from the W.E.C., and which extends thence S. 12° E. to mouth. Value \$60.00.

Oversight

No.1, the discovery, shaft, 4 x 6 x 14 ft., the center of the east side of which is on the lode line 59.00 ft. from the S.E.C. Value \$120.00.

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Instrument.

This survey was made with a 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch Berger Engineer's transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Polaris observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

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Report.

The side and end lines of these claims were run direct upon the ground. The tie to the section corner common to Sections 30 and 31, was computed through the section tie from Cor. No.1, of the Fulton lode, Sur. 2686, an approved survey, executed by me.

Survey No. 2686, Fulton and Copper Queen lodes:

The corners of these claims are 4 x 4 posts, properly set and scribed. I find ^{the bearing of} line 1-2, of said Fulton lode, and line 4-1, of said Copper Queen lode correct as approved.

The section corner common to Sections 30 and 31, to

which tie is given is a schist stone .4 x .7 x 1.3 ft. out of the ground, marked with one groove on the south, five grooves on the north and 15 E on the east.

The disagreement between these notes and the notices of location is due to errors in the latter.
