ADJOINING CLAIMS.

The Katherine, Margaret, Grantley, Denver, Germanic and Chester lodes all surround the Leviathan Lode, Survey No. 580.

The Chester lode joined the Romona lode, unsurveyed, D. J. Sayer, claimant on the WestEnd.

I thoroughly satisfied myself, while on the ground making the survey, that the improvements mentioned above, were all made by the claimant and its grantors.

I found corners Nos. 2 and 3 of the Leviathan Lode, Sur. No. 580, standing in good shape as described in the notes for this survey. I was unable to find marked stones for corners numbered 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8. I found, however, posts well marked in mounds of stone which were undoubtedly the correct location for their respective corners.

I do not agree with this older survey in course by six minutes, but 1 found the distances correct. This discrepancy is due to error in the older survey.

'I tied Cor. No. 1 of each of the claims of this survey to U.S.M.M. No. 1. In addition to these ties, I tied Cor. No. 1, Katherine lode to U.S.L.M. 1971, which I knew to exist.

This will show the relation between these two Mineral Monuments.

It would be evident from the arrangement of the claims embraced in this survey, that any improvement which would be common to this group, would also be common to the Leviathan Lode, Sur. No. 580. At present the owners of this group hold an option on the Leviathan to purchase this claim, and the work has been planned, according to above statements regarding the common improvements?




