The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. Distances were measured with IOO.ft. and 300.ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lines of locations embraced in this claim were run directly upon the ground, as indicated in field notes. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground, or by traverses run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

I marked the exact corner points on monuments by small nails driven in the tops of posts, at exact point. The S.E.Cor.of Sec.26, T 17 S, R 10 E, G & S.R.M., is a square porphyry rock I ft.above ground, scribed (I) on S.face and (I) on E.face. No mound of stones near, nor any bearing rocks nor trees to be found.
