On dates May 20 and 21, in accordance with special instructions for Group 155, Arisona, dated April 10, 1925, I made an investigation, on the ground, of rht location relative to the public land surveys in Secs. 18 and 19, 7. 1 S., R. S R., and Secs. 15 and 24, 7. 1 S., R. S R., Gila Base and Meridian, Arisons, of the following patented mining claims: The Maxmaillion and Leggat, Minoral Survey No. 2899; the Delta, Delta Re. S. Delta Ro. 5, and Richard Staunton, Hineral Survey No. 2900; the Hall and Thempson, Mineral Survey No. 8107; and the Ore Grande, Mineral Survey No. 5876.

I find from retracements, that the bearings and longths of the boundaries of all of these claims, with the exception of the last mentioned, are substantially the some as of record.
