NOTICE of LOCATION,

That we the undersigned, have this day located 1500 feet of this vein or lode, bearing precious metals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, with surface ground 300 ft on each side of vein, with all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber and water thereon or appurtenant thereto, according to the provisions of the United States Mining Laws.
