L O C A T I O N .

This claim is located upon surveyed land, sections 25 and 36, T. 13 N., R. 2 W. of the G. & S. R. B. & M. in the Hassayampa Mining District, Yavapai County, Arizona, within the Prescott National Forest.

I N S T R U M E N T .

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons transit, No. 1 C.; The distances were measured with a 600 and a 100 foot steel tape. All courses were deflected from true meridian as determined by direct solar observation.

R E P O R T .

The discrepancies between this claim, as marked upon the ground by the location monuments and as described in the location notice, are due to error in the location notice.

I thoroughly satisfied myself while on the ground making the survey, that the improvements mentioned above and accredited to this claim, were made by the claimant and her grantors.

I do not agree with the courses and distances as reported in the field notes for the King Kelly lode, Mineral Survey No. 1465. I found the corners mentioned above in a state of good preservation.; I tied to these corners, and the courses and distances reported by me, are the result of careful field and

The length of this claim is 1500 feet and I claim 800 feet in a Northerly direction and 700 feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South

The claim is situated and located in the Hassayampia Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about Seven Miles in a Southerly direction from the City of Prescott and midway between the Chicago and the Empire Mines on Groom Creek. It was formerly known as the Independence Mining Claim.
