INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit reading to single minutes on the horizontal limb.

All courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a Polaris observation.

All distances were measured with a 100 foot steel tape graduated to hundredths.

At 12h 24^m A.M. 1. m. t. June 24, 1912, I observe Polaris at eastern elongation, and mark the line thus established by driving an iron pin in the ground 300 feet north of my station which is

Cor. No. 4 of the Rooster Lode. At 7:30^{A.M.} of the same date I deflect from the line previously marked $1^{\circ}-24'$ to the west and from the meridian thus established all courses of this survey are deflected.

No. 1157 is N. $52^{\circ} 41'$ W. 2241.7 ft. rather than N. $52^{\circ} 48'$ W. 2232.1 ft., and the side line of the Mammoth lode, (line 2-3) is N. 45° W. 1514.6 ft. rather than N. 45° W. 1500 ft.
