The data contained in these notes is accurate, and designed to correct said errors in the location notices. On Black Dyke No.I8 and Black Dyke No.I4 Lodes, the Discovery Points mark the center of mineral deposit, the evidence at said points Proves conclusively that the formation exists as indicated in my ledge statement; the ore deposit is considered to be of the type of a general mineralization of the country rock rather than a small vein, and holes were dug where physical conditions of the ground were most advantageous.

an Act to Codify and Revise the Laws of the Territory of Arizona SECTIONS I-II.-INC. LOCATION OF CLAIMS Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Arizona: Section 1. On the discovery of mineral in places on the public domain of the United States, the same may be located as a mineral claim by the discoverer for himself, for himself and others, or for others.

Section 2. Such location shall be made by erecting at or contiguous to the point of discovery, a conspicuous monument of stones not less than three (3) feet in height, or an upright past securely fixed, projecting at less four (4) feet above the ground, in which monument of stones or on which post, there shall be posted a location notice, which shall be signed by the name or names of the locator or locators.
