TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the BIG A NUFF Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by G.H.Hodges and Bill Hobbs, citizens of United States on January 19<sup>th</sup> 1907, and amended by Julius Riser and Patrick Rose, citizens of the United States, the undersigned, on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1909.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet and we claim 400 feet, in a westerly direction and 1100 feet, in an easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim; The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the east to the west.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District, in Gila County, in the Territory of Arizona, about one-half mile in a southerly direction from the Live Oak Mine and joins the Copper Vault on the west, the Joiner on the south, the Hard Times on the east, Copper Queen, Cotton Tail No.1 and other claims on the north.
