This survey was made with a Gurley Solar Transit, The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes. The lode lines of each location were run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets therefrom. The tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

Common Improvement.

Tunnel No. 7 American Flag lode a common improvement is so located that by continuing it in its present course and by crosscuts and drifts each lode in this claim can be developed. From the mouth of this tunnel the surface rises to the North and West and descends to the East.
