This survey was made with a Buff and Berger light mountain mining transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by Polaris observations. The distances were measured with 5 ft., 50 ft., and 500 ft. steel tapes.

U. S. L. M. No. 2 is a pine post 6 ins. square 7 ft. high properly set and scribed.

Sur. No. 1712, Regulation, Good Boy and Last Spike lodes:

All corners were pine posts properly set and scribed.

I find all courses and distances to be correct as approved.

The end centers of this lode are pine posts, 4 ins. square, 3 ft. high, with mound of stone.

After a thorough search I fail to find any corners of the public land surveys within two miles of this survey.

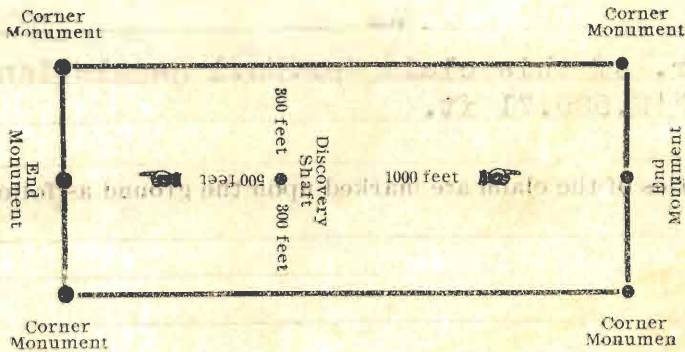
