NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION  
LODE CLAIM

To all whom it may concern:

This mining claim, the name of which is the BLACK SHEEP Mining claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Henry L. Heinbuckel, the undersigned, on the 28 day of July, 1901.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred 1500 feet, and I claim one thousand two hundred 1200 feet in a Northerly direction, and three hundred 300 feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Northerly to the Southerly.

The claim is situated and located in the Copper Mountain Mining District, in Graham County, in the Territory of Arizona, about three miles in a Northerly direction from Morenci near the head of the Coronado Incline.
