

Dear Sir:

On dates May 20 and 21, in accordance with Special Instructions for Group No. 185, Arizona, dated April 10, 1925, I made an investigation, on the ground, of the location relative to the public land surveys in Secs. 18 and 19, T. 1 S., R. 5 E., and Secs. 15 and 24, T. 1 S., R. 2 E., Gila Base and Meridian, Arizona, of the following patented mining claims: The Mexamillion and Leggat, Mineral Survey No. 2899; the Delta, Delta No. 2, Delta No. 5, and Richard Staunton, Mineral Survey No. 2900; the Hall and Thompson, Mineral Survey No. 3107; and the Oro Grande, Mineral Survey No. 3276.

I find from retracements, that the bearings and lengths of the boundaries of all of these claims, with the exception of the last mentioned, are substantially the same as of record.

The boundaries of the Oro Grande, however, were found to be slightly at variance with the record both in alinement and measurement of the side lines, inasmuch as the end lines of this claim were found to have a bearing and length of S. 75° 20' W., 9.08 chs., instead of S. 75° 26' W., 9.09 chs.; and the side lines a bearing and length of N. 16° 39' W., 22.58 chs., instead of N. 14° 54' W., 22.715 chs., indicated in the record.

From the cor. of Secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, T. 1 S., Re. 2 and 3 R., Cor. No. 4 of Delta No. 3, N. S. No. 2900, brs. 3. 35° 17' E., 9.74 chs.; Cor. No. 2, Legget, M. S. No. 2899, brs. 8. 76° 25' E., 34.23 chs.; and Cor. No. 1, of Hall and Cor. No. 4 of Thompson, M. S. 5107, brs. N. 31° 52' W., 11.86 chs. From the quarter-section cor. of Secs. 18 and 19. T. 1 S., R. 5 R., Cor. No. 2, Oro Grande, of M. S. No. 5276, brs. N. 6° 16' W., 32.79 chs.

Attached hereto is a plat of the afore-mentioned sections in T. 1 S., Rs. 2 and S E., on which is shown the true location of said mining claims with relation to same.
