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To All Whom It May Concern:

SEP. 30. 1914

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Alaska Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by J.A. Stratton, who is a citizen of the United States, the undersigned, on the First day of January 1910. 1910

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred feet, and I claim fifty feet, in a Southerly direction and fourteen hundred & fifty feet in a Northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with three hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the South to the North.

The claim is situated and located in the Walker Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about five miles in a North Easterly direction from Walker and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles South of old hydrolic dam and 1 mile East of Walker Mail road.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows: Beginning at a monument of Stone at a point in a Southerly direction fifty feet from the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted), being in the center of the South end line of said claim; thence three hundred feet to a monument of stone, being the South East corner of said claim thence fifteen hundred feet to a monument of stone, being at the North East corner of said claim; thence three hundred feet to a monument of stone at the center of the North end of said claim; thence three hundred feet to a monument of stone, being at the North West corner of said claim; thence fifteen hundred feet to a monument of stone at the South West corner of said claim; thence three hundred feet to the place of beginning.
