AMENDED NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION
LODE CLAIM

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This mining claim, the name of which is the "DON MIGUEL NO. 6" Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there is a vein or lode of mineral bearing rock in place carrying gold, silver, copper and other valuable deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Alfred Paul, a citizen of the United States, the undersigned, on the 18th day of February, 1916.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet and I claim 60 feet of the lode in a Westerly direction, and 1440 feet of the lode in an Easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the claim and the lode therein is from the East to the West.

The claim is situated and located in the Warren Mining District, in Cochise County, in the State of Arizona, about three-quarters of a mile in a Northeasterly direction from the shaft of the Portage Lake Mining Company, and the Southwesterly corner thereof is about 800 feet in a Northwesterly direction from the Northwesterly corner of Sec. 31, Tp. 23 S., R. 25. E., Gila & Salt River Base and Meridian.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows:
