Instrument.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by Solar observations made with a Burt Solar attachment. The distances were measured with 5,50, and 500ft steel tapes.

Adjoining Lodes.

This survey is bounded on the north by survey 2312, Annie and Bird Lodes, Iron Cap Copper Company Claimants; on the East by survey No. 2430 Fraction Lode, Iron Cap Copper Company, claimant; on the South by survey No. 631, Cochise Lode, Arizona Commercial Copper Company Claimant; and on the West by survey No. 2304, Gem Lode, Globe Consolidated Mining Company claimant.

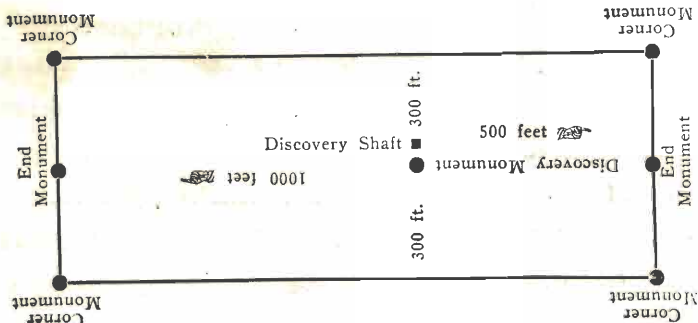

This diagram is to give locator a general idea of plan of location under the new law. The Discovery Shaft can be in the center of claim any distance from either end desired. In the diagram it is placed 500 feet from one end and 1000 feet from the other. Commence description of claim at a center end monument, giving its distance and direction from center of Discovery Shaft; thence bound the claim in either direction. In description be careful to state locality of claim with reference to some natural object, or permanent monument, as will identify the claim.
