INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff and Berger light mountain transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by Polaris observations. The distances were measured with 5, 50 and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The E. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 12, T.4 S., R.28 E., G. & S. R. B & M. is a rod with brass cap properly set and marked. Sur. No. 3145 Dominion lode.

Cors. Nos. 2 and 3 are posts properly set and scribed.

The survey of the lode of this location is identical with the location as staked upon the ground.

The differences between these field notes and the location certificate are due to errors in the latter.

All end centers are mounds of stone.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Harry Wright, the undersigned, has this 30 day of March 1904 AMENDED, Located and Claimed, and by these presents does AMEND, Locate and Claim by right of the original discovery of this additional and amended location certificate on the "VICTOR" lode, <sup>vein,</sup> ledge or deposit along the vein thereof, with all its dips, angles and variations.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 1090 feet in a Northeasterly direction, and 410 feet in a Southwesterly direction from the center of the discovery cut, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds on each side of the center of said claim.

The general course of the lode, deposit and premises is from the Northeast to the Southwest.

The claim is situated and located in the Copper Mountain Mining District, in Graham County, in the Territory of Arizona, U. S. L. M. No. 1, bears from the East corner N. 66° 30' E. 6770 ft.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows:
