INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Lietz Mining Transit, No. 460. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct astronomical observations. The distances were measured with 50ft., and 200 ft. steel tapes.

About 7 30 P.M., I commence observing the western progress of Polaris: When the star begins to recede I mark the maximum position in azimuth upon the ground. From Table IV the corresponding azimuth is found to be I 24.

March I6, I lay off the meridian I 24 to the east of the line of observation.

REPORT.

The lode line of each location was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground or by traverses, run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith: The corner common to sections IO, II, I4 and I5, T.23 N.R. IS W., G.& S.R.M., is a granite rock 24xI5x5 ins., chiseled, with 4 notches on the south and 2 notches on the east faces. in an old mound of stone. The bearing given from Cor. No. I, Sur.No.1389, of S.O'I7'E.appears to be in error as I make it exactly S.2 00'E by two separate surveys each independent of the other. The distance however agrees very exactly with that given by the official plat of Sur. No. 1389, showing that the corner is where it was at the time of the Midnight lode survey No. 1389. I ran the exterior boundaries of section IO, T. 23 N.R. I8 W. G.& S.R.M.with the aid of the field notes of said sec. IO

furnished by your office and could find no traces of the original corners. The corner to sections 3,4,9 and IO does not appear to have been in existance at the time of the official survey of the Valley View, Sonoma and Silver Bell lodes in sections 4,9 and IO. The connecting line being made with the N.E. Corner of Sec. 3. The miners are in the habit of using the mounds of rock in building their mineral location monuments so that the identity of any rock found with the markings is uncertain and unreliable. I therefore made the connections of the different lode claims embraced in this survey with the section corner common to sections IO, II, I4 and I5 above mentioned, computing the intersections with the line between sections IO and II in accordance with the original record of such line.

The location corners of each of the locations in this survey, were pine posts in rock mounds properly scribed, designating each particular corner, with the exception of side center monuments, none of which could be found.

Survey No. 2830 Towne lode, I find the stone corners in place and properly marked.

A common improvement for each of the six locations embraced in this survey, is a shaft on the Midnight lode, Sur. No. I389, the top of which is 449 ft.S.71°34'W.from Cor. No. I, Buckey O'Neil lode of this survey. Shaft is 6x9 ft., 30I ft. deep, timbered and of a value of \$9030. One seventh of which valuation, \$1290 is credited to each location. The remaining I/7 is credited to the Midnight lode, Sur. No. I389.




