TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Winnebago Mining Claim situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Jas. C. Frick, Citizen, the undersigned, on the Sixth 6 day of October, 1908.

The length of this claim is Fifteen Hundred feet and I claim Five Hundred feet in a northerly direction, and One Thousand feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with Three Hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the southerly to the northerly.

The claim is situated and located in the Warren Mining District, in Cochise County, in the Territory of Arizona, about three miles in a westerly direction from Bisbee Proper, situated about 1000 feet S. E. direction from the bend of the County Road as it starts up the grade in Tombstone Canon, and joins the South of Copper Queen surface and mining property.
