Ajo Mining District, Pima County, Arizona.

In connection with U.S. Mineral Survey No. 3457, same being situated on unsurveyed public land, I found that U.S. Mineral Monument No. I, Ajo Mining District, Pima County, Ariz., constituted the nearest established ^{mineral monument} to which to tie the locations of the above survey. This mineral monument I found to have been entirely destroyed by long exposure to the weather, so it was necessary to re-establish same.

The notes of original establishment of U.S.M.M. No I, Ajo Mining District, Pima County, Arizona, are as follows:-

"Monument established Dec. 14, 1882. On apex of large conglomerate rock 40 x 60 feet and 50 feet high, on east side of Gunsight and Gila Bend road, I drilled a hole 4 feet deep, and tamped into same some copper-(Bronze) ore. 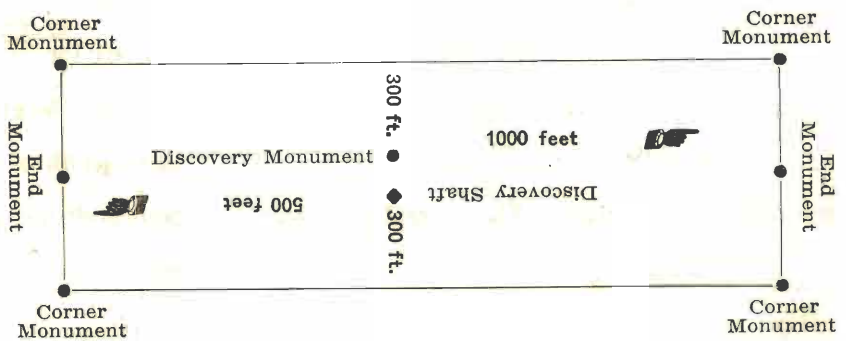

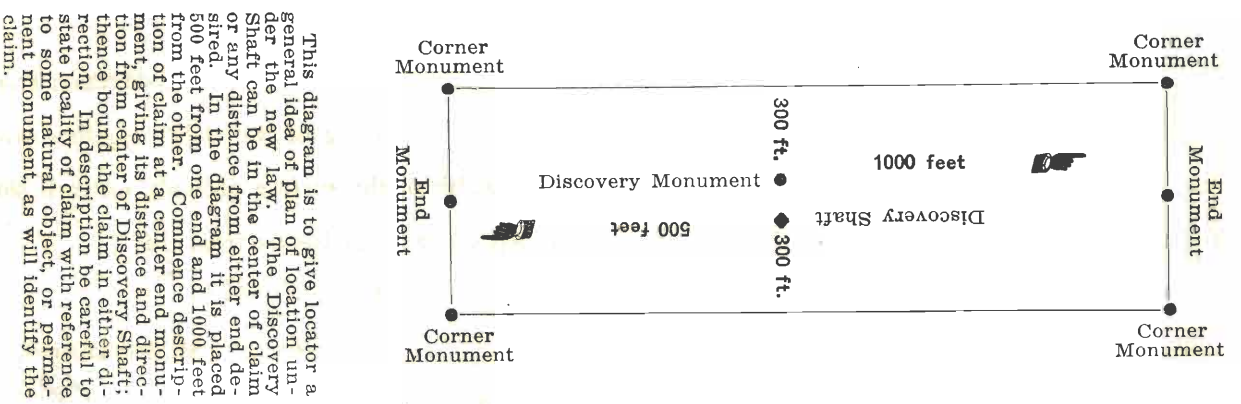

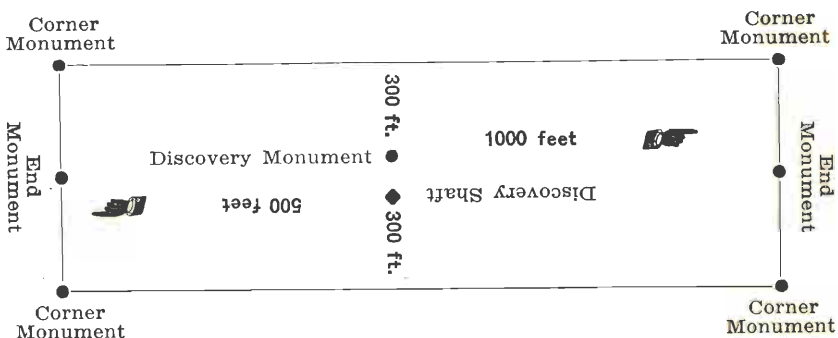
