INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Solar Transit. The courses were determined by direct Solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lode line of this claim was run directly upon the ground and the corners were established by means of offsets from the lode line. The tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

U.S.M.M. No.1, C.B.M.D. is an oak post 8"x8" x7' high set in mound of stone and scribed U S M M No 1 C B M D.

Corner to secs. 9,10,15 and 16, T.13 N.,R.3 W. is a properly marked stone in a mound of stone.

All old patent corners were found to be 3"x3" oak posts 3 ft. high set in mound of stone except cor. No. 3 of sur. <sup>No.</sup> 489, Coppersmith lode which was not found. The course of the line 2-3 was taken as given in the notes of sur. <sup>No.</sup> 489.

The courses of lines 2-3, sur. <sup>No.</sup> 487, Cross lode; 5-6 and 2-1-6 of sur. <sup>No.</sup> 491, Quartz Hill lode were found to be in error. The length of line 5-6 of sur. <sup>No.</sup> 491, Quartz Hill lode was found in error. The tie of sur. <sup>No.</sup> 489, Coppersmith lode was found in error.

The difference between this survey and the location notice at the North end was due to an error in writing the location notice.

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Billy Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by Biles Lockhart Clothing Co. \_\_\_\_\_ the undersigned, on the 17 day of November, 1917

The length of this claim is 1140 feet, and we claim 60 feet, in a Southerly direction and 1080 feet in a Northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South

The claim is situated and located in the Copper Basin Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the State of Arizona, about 900 in a Westerly direction from U. S. M. M. No 1 C. B. M. D.
