Corners and centers of Edna No.1 lode, Sunrise Nos.1,2 and 3 lodes, America No.3 lode, and Edna No.6 lode, all unsurveyed, are 4x4 pine posts.

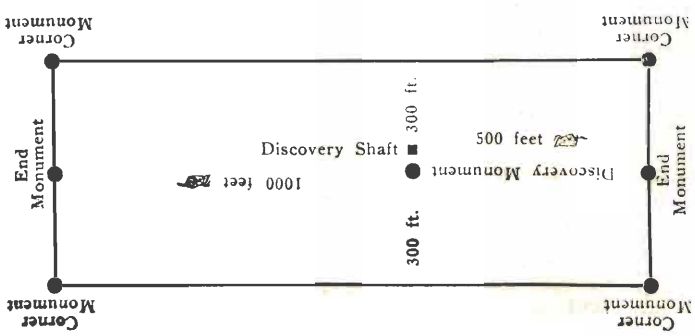

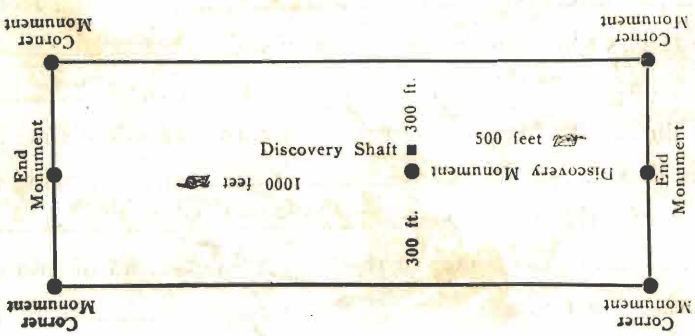
