This survey was made with a Gurley engineers transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a Burt Solar Attachment. The distances were measured with 100 and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT

The 1/4 Cor. common to Sec. 5 & 8, T.1N., R.15E., G. & S.R. B. & M. is a quartzite stone 22 ins. by 12 ins. lying flat on ground and chiseled with 8-1/4-5 S. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey which can be found and indentified.

Survey 1638-

Bonita lode, I find line 2-3 in error 3 minutes in bearing and 2.36 ft. in distance. Cors. No. 2 & 3 are pine posts properly scribed.

Holmes lode, I find Cors. No. 1 & 2 are pineposts properly scribed. Line 1-2 in error 8 minutes in bearing and 5.33 ft, in distance.


Gordon lode, I find Cors. No. 1 & 2 are pine posts properly set and scribed, line 1-2 in error 3 minutes in bearing.

Rosaline No. 10 Sur. No. 2701, I find Cor. No. 1 is a white pine post properly set and improperly scribed, having scribed 2-2701-R10 and 2-2494-S; Cor. No. 2 is a white pine post properly set and scribed. I find lines 2-3 correct as approved, line 1-2 is in error 3 minutes in bearing.

NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION
LODE CLAIM

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:-

This mining claim, the name of which is the HAMBURG Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by CLARA KINNEY, a citizen of the United States of America, the undersigned, on the 26th. day of February, 1919.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 750 feet in a northwesterly direction and 750 feet in a southeasterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the northwest to the southeast.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District in Gila County, in the State of Arizona, about seven miles in a northwest direction from Globe and about one mile east of Sleeping Beauty Mountain.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows: Beginning at the north end center monument, a white pine post, being 750 feet northwest of the center of the discovery shaft on which this notice is posted; thence 186 feet southwesterly to a pine post, the northwest corner, said corner being identical with the northeast corner of the Bonita Lode, Mineral Survey No. 1638; thence southeasterly, along and coinciding with the east end lines of the Bonita, Holmes and Gordon claims, Mineral Survey No. 1638, to a pine post on the said east end line of the Gordon Mining Claim, at a point 313 feet southeasterly from the northeast corner of said Gordon claim, being the southwest corner of the Hamburg mining claim; thence 166 feet northeasterly to a pine post, the south end center; thence 300 feet northeasterly to a pine post, the southeast corner; thence northeasterly 1500 feet to a pine post, the northeast corner; thence 300 feet southwesterly to a pine post, the north end center, the place of beginning.
