This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons No. 4 transit. The courses were deflected from a meridian established by observing Polaris at western elongation. The distances were measured with a Lufkin 660 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

U.S.L.M. No. 3584 is a solid rock face 4 x 5 ft. slightly elevated above the immediately surrounding ground, chiseled U.S.L.M. 2584 and a cross at the exact point.

Cor. to Secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9 and the # Sec. Cor. to

Secs. 4 and 9, T. 11 N., R. 14 W., G.S. R. M., consist of the standard iron posts with brass caps which have been adopted for use on the public surveys by the U.S. General Land Office and are properly marked.

Cor. No. 1-1 Vermont and New Hampshire lodes, Sur. No. 2584 is a rock in place 10 x 16 ins. x 10 ins. above ground, chiseled Vl, NHl, NCEM and a cross at corner point.
