230 ft. deep and was sunk to develop the veins of the being on the vein that runs thru the center of both claims of this survey; it is lower than the vein in the Juror No. 2 lade, making it possible to drift under said lade at a considerable depth and to develop both claims two claims of this survey and I therefore value it at at aminimum expense,
