Whence a Cedar tree 6 ins. in diam. bears N88°15'W -28.2 ft. blazed and scribed x-B.T.- U.S.L.M. 3636. A Rock 3x3x4 ft. chiseled x-B.R.-U.S.L.M.-3636 bears N22°10'E 22.5 feet. 
