This survey was made with a light mountain W.& L.E.Gurley transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 50 ft. and 600 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT

The lode line of each of the locations of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines.

All tie lines were run directly upon the ground or by traverse.

The Public Land corners to which this survey is tied I found to be brass capped pipe properly marked.

The old workings herein shown as other improvements were made many years ago when it was thought they were off the Indian Reservation.
