#### LOCATION.

This survey is located in Sec. 35, T. 22 S., R. 15 E. Gila and Salt River Meridian; within the Coronado National Forest.

#### EXPENDITURE OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

The report of the expenditure of five hundred dollars will be returned later.

#### OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

Tunnel, averaging 4 x 6 ft., 140.5 ft.long, and open cut, averaging 6 x 5 ft., 27 ft.long. The mouth of tunnel, where it breaks cover, bears N. 76° 17' E. 825.5 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Senator Lodge No. 1 lode, of this survey, and tunnel runs thence N. 9° 591' E. 140.5 ft. to face. Open cut runs thence S. 9° 59' W. 27.0 ft. from face, which is at mouth of tunnel.

Tunnel, averaging 4 x 4 ft., 10 ft.long, and open cut 4.5 x 4 x 18 ft.long. The mouth of tunnel, where it breaks cover bears N. 69° 51' E. 855.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Senator Lodge No. 1 lode, of this survey; and tunnel runs thence N. 24° 30' W. 10.0 ft. to face. Open cut runs S. 24° 30' E. 18.0 ft. from face, which is at mouth of tunnel.

Open cut, averaging 5 ft. wide, 6 ft. deep, 67.5 ft. long, the mouth of which, where it breaks ground, bears N. 59° 03' E. 669.5 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Senator Lodge No. 1 lode, of this survey; and cut runs thence S. 23° 30' E. 23.5 ft. to point "a"; thence S. 8° 00' E. 33.0 ft. to face. From point "a" cut also runs thence S. 85° 30' W. 13.0 ft. to face.

Open cut, averaging 6 x 3.5 ft., 15 ft. long, the mouth of which, where it breaks ground, bears N. 73° 23' E. 712.7 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Senator Lodge No. 1 lode of this survey; and cut runs thence N. 17° E. 15.0 ft. to face.

Open cut, averaging 8 x 10 x 3 ft.deep, the center of which bears N. 68° Ol' E. 903.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Senator Lodge No. 1 lode of this survey.

Shaft 5 x 6 x 8.0 ft. deep, the center of which bears N. 63° 58' E. 599.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Senator Lodge No. 1 lode, of this survey.

Shaft 4 x 6 x 7.5 ft. deep, the center of which bears N. 67° 10' E. 945.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Senator Lodge No. 1 lode, of this survey.

Tunnel, averaging 4 x 6 ft., 19.5 ft.long, and open cut averaging 5 x 5 ft., 20 ft. long. The mouth of tunnel, where it breaks cover, bears S. 57° 28' W. 365.0 ft. from Cor. No. 4, Senator Lodge No. 2 lode, of this survey; and tunnel runs thence N. 42° 37' E. 1.5 ft. to a point; thence N. 23° E. 18.0 ft. to face. Open cut runs S. 42° 37' W. 20.0 ft. from face, which is at mouth of tunnel.

Store house, 24.2 ft. x 26.3 ft., the SW.corner of which bears N. 5° 29' E. 103.7 ft. from Cor. No. 2 Senator Lodge No. 2 lode of this survey. Course of long

side is N. 14° W. Claimant herein.

House, the SE.corner of which bears S. 57° 33' W.2.2 ft. from Cor. No. 2, Senator Lodge No. 2 lode, of this survey; thence N. 27° 14' W. 31.4 ft.; thence S. 62°46' W. 31.9 ft.; thence S. 27° 14' E. 16.3 ft.; thence N. 62° 46' E.22.1 ft.; thence S. 27° 14' E. 15.1 ft.; thence N. 62° 46' W. 9.8 ft. to SE.corner, the place of beginning. A porch 7.4 x 32.2 ft. extends across the NW.face of building. Claimant herein.

A frame house, 12.3 ft. x 25.6 ft., the Sw.corner of which bears N. 33° 05' W. 129.7 ft. from Cor. No. 2 Senator Lodge No. 2 lode, of this survey. Course of long side is N. 33° E. Claimant herein.

A frame house 12 x 14 ft., the SE.corner of which bears N. 54° 25' W. 143.2 ft. from Cor. No. 2, Senator Lodge No. 2 lode of this survey. Course of long side is N. 83° E. Claimant herein.

Note:

The cuts, tunnels, and shafts, described above, were done by Col. R. R. Richardson prior to the date of location of the Senator Lodge No. 1, and Senator Lodge No. 2 lodes, of this survey; and so could not be applied as an expenditure of five hundred dollars to same.

#### INSTRUMENŢ.

This survey was made with a Lietz transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a direct solar observation, the details of which are returned herewith. The distances were measured with a 100 ft. and two 300 ft. steel tapes.

#### REPORT.

The section corner common to Secs. 34 and 35 on the south boundary of T. 22 S., R. 15 E., G. & S.R.M., is an iron pipe, 3 ins. in diam., with brass cap on top, and extends 3 ft. above the ground, and is set in a large mound of stones. Brass cap is marked T 22 S on north half; T 23 S 1913 on south half; R 15 E on west; S 34 in NW.quadrant; S35 in NE.quadrant; S2 in SE.quadrant; and S3 in SW.quadrant. Corner further identified by two oak bearing trees.

I was unable to find the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corners on the east and west boundaries of Sec. 35 T. 22 S., R. 15 E., G. & S.R. M.

The iron post set for the \(\frac{1}{4}\) sec.cor. on the south boundary of Sec.35 T. 22 S., R. 15 E., G. & S.R.M., has been destroyed or carried away. I found a mound of stones at the approximate location of said corner.
