As near as can be determined from present development the vein of the location embraced in this survey extends as follows from its discovery point:

Eurida No.4 lode, 550 ft. running N.50° 00'E. and 950 ft. running S.78° 00'W.

AREA.

Total area Eurida No.4 lode, 20,661 acres.

LOCATION.

This survey is located upon unsurveyed lands, approx. in Sec. 15, T. 13N, R. 8W, Navajo Base & Meridian, upon the Navajo Indian reservation. The approximate latitude is 36° 46'N and the approximate longitude is 109° 12'W.

IMPROVEMENTS.

I certify, that the labor and improvements made upon or for the benefit of the location embraced in said mining claim, by the claimants or their grantors is as follows:

No.1 - The discovery cut ~~Eurida No.4~~, the mouth of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line 550 ft. from the center of line 1-2, 6 ft. wide, 2 ft. deep, running N.50° 00'E. 20 ft. to face.

No.2 - An open cut, the mouth of which is on the lode line 925 ft. from the center of line 4-5, 4 ft. wide, 6 ft. face, running N.78° 00'E. 20 ft. to face.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

INSTRUMENT.

The instrument used in making this survey was a Buff & Buff Mining transit.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with a five hundred foot steel tape.

REPORT.

The lode line of the location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

U.S.M.M.No.2 is a sandstone, 30 ins.long, 20 ins.by 6 ins.square, set 18 ins.in the ground, chiseled with an X on top and U.S.M.M.No.2, EURIDA on the east side.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.

Note;- The discovery cut of the location embraced in this survey shows ore or a vein in place. The lode line, which has an angle in it is located following the ledge or vein which outcrops and is readily traced upon the ground.

DESCRIPTION OF U.S.M.M.No.2.
